Sharing life, gaining independence.

When families are unable to provide care for their loved ones with developmental disabilities, we offer Lifesharing services to satisfy their unmet needs. Through Lifesharing, these individuals enjoy the benefits of nurturing homes and qualified host families, specifically trained to provide support and personalized, long-term care.

Individuals in the Lifesharing program attend school, work and day programs. As they become more comfortable in their new homes, they begin to forge new relationships and lead fuller, more fulfilling lives.

A qualified, compassionate host-family.

Lifesharing is based on the needs of each individual. Before moving in together, host families and care recipients meet to gather information and ensure a good match. Host families also receive constant support and guidance from colleagues and Access Services' professional Lifesharing teams.

All host families undergo an extensive application process, submit multiple references, pass a thorough home safety inspection and criminal, child abuse and police background screenings. Finally, there is a home study process in which an Access Services employee interviews the host family in their environment.



The role of the natural family.

Families of care recipients are encouraged to take part in the Lifesharing process as much as possible. Once the Lifesharing program begins, the natural family is able to continue being a part of their loved one's life through visits, support, holidays spent together and participation in team meetings. The ongoing role of each family is unique to each situation.
