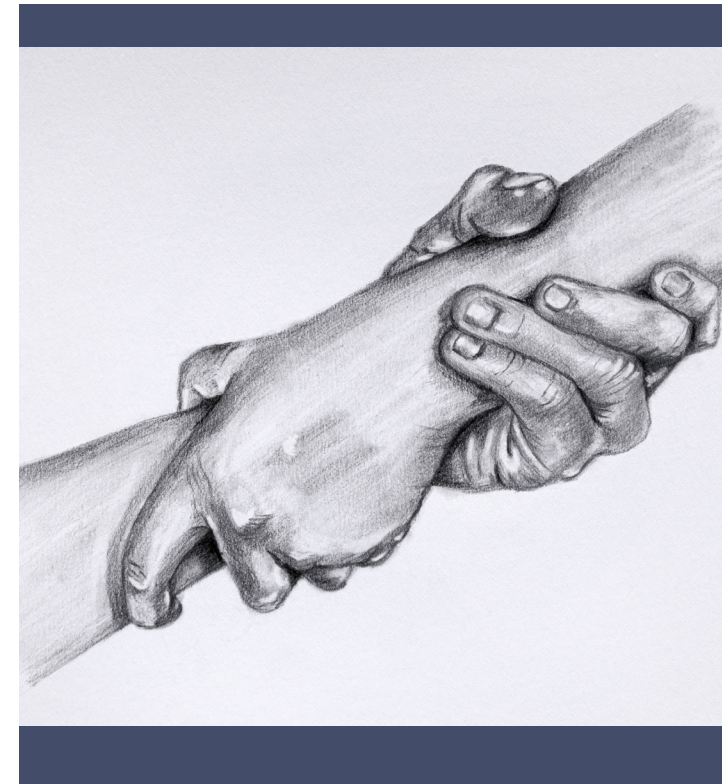

We collaborate to help adults with mental health challenges navigate the forensic system, whether currently incarcerated or navigating re-entry into the local community.

JRS is voluntary. To participate in the program, you must be:

- 18 years or older
- A resident of Montgomery county
- Have an active pending criminal court case or on probation
- Have a mental illness diagnosis
