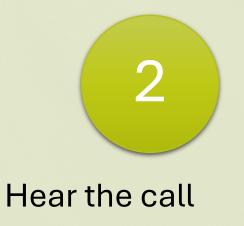


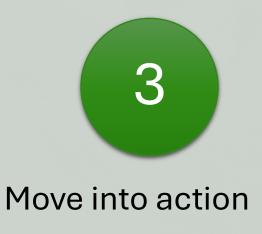

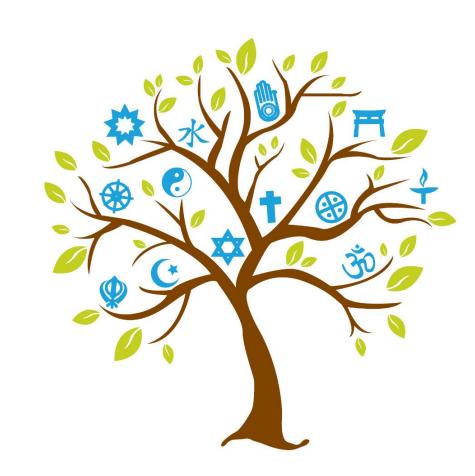

"How many socks?"



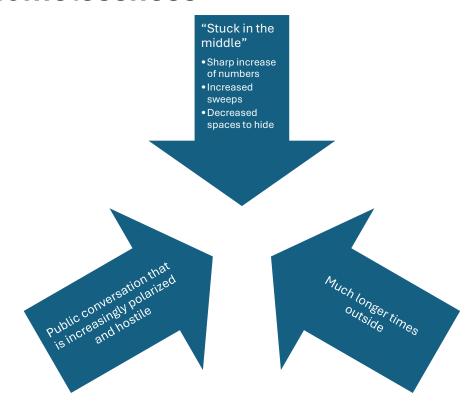
- Relief/Charity

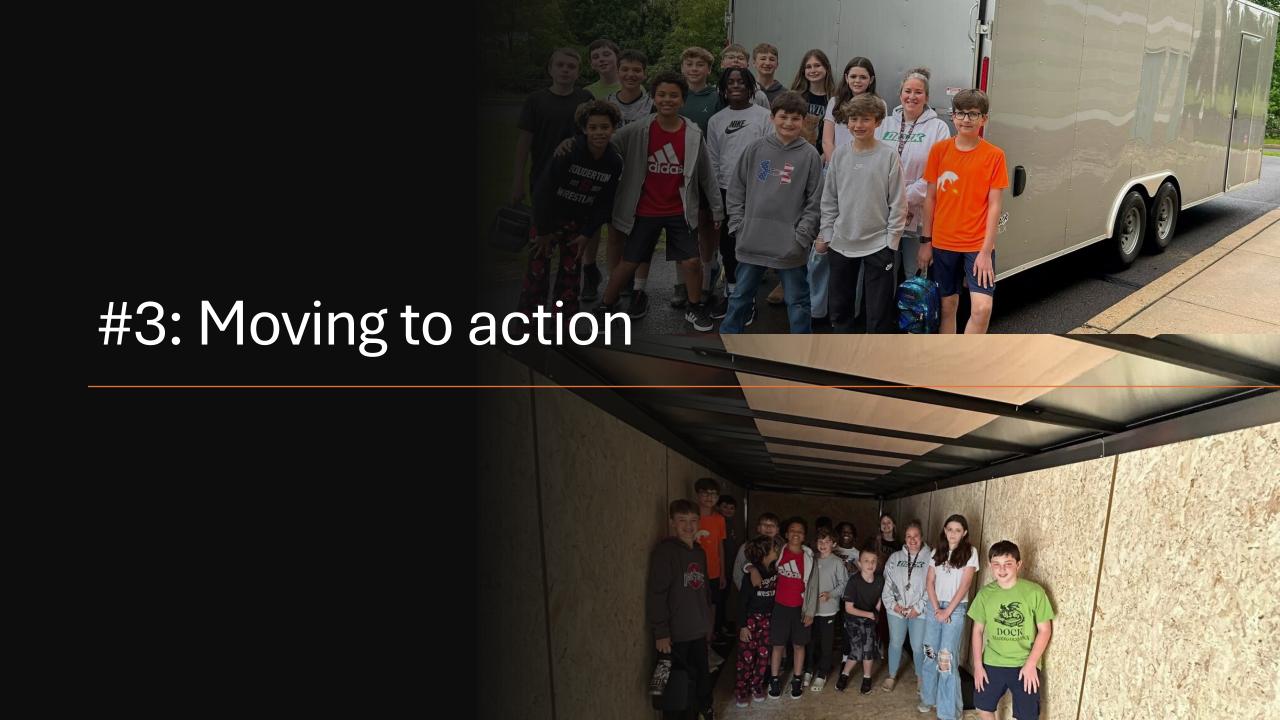


Homelessness

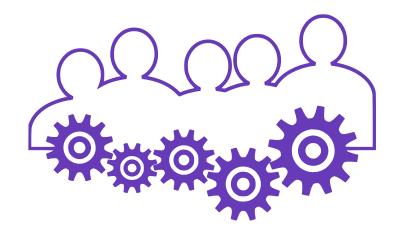


Housing
